Alcohol: 14,00% Vol. Bottling: June 2019 Production: 4500 bottles Since the 2005 vintage, this wine has been a fundamental piece in the history of Quinta Nova de Nossa Senhora do Carmo in its utmost expression of terroir. Coming from the first Monovarietal vineyards of Touriga Nacional planted in the Douro Demarcated Region, today with 45 years old, in a 1.5 ha vineyard with east-south-west exposure, a mixture of clones whose productivity is very low, with very small and small berries. Unique, this highly concentrated Touriga Nacional blend, combined with centuries-old old vines, results in a very elegant, almost feminine profile wine, in contrast to an intense structure of extremely precise juicy tannins. The schist texture, high gravity, sap profile and purple color reflect well the nature of the Touriga Nacional variety.
